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# Appendix A Personal Information Collection Statement – Advisors Under National Promotion Programs

At Telefilm Canada ("**Telefilm**"), greater diversity, inclusion and equity are at the heart of our values. Telefilm aims to retain the services of external advisors who are reflective of regional and cultural diversity as well as underrepresented groups and gender parity. These external advisors assist Telefilm in reviewing different activities, events, festivals or projects submitted under its national promotion programs and make recommendations.

This Statement explains why personal information is being collected and what it will be used for.

The personal information of individuals interested in being considered to act as external advisors is collected for the purposes of identifying and selecting individuals to serve as external advisors. This personal information may also be used to maintain an inventory of potential candidates. Such personal information may include, among other things, first and last names, contact information (e.g., email address, phone number, mailing address), biographical information, work history and/or curriculum vitae (resume).

Furthermore, additional personal information provided by candidates on a voluntary basis through self declaration is collected for the purposes of retaining the services of external advisors who reflect regional and cultural diversity as well as underrepresented groups and gender parity. Such personal information may include, among other categories, Indigenous identity, racial and ethnic identity, gender identity, belonging to the 2SLGBTQIA+ Community, disability status as well as belonging to an official language minority community.

In the case of selected candidates, other personal information may be collected for the purposes of administering their participation as advisors. Such personal information may include, among other things, financial institution information, social insurance number (SIN) and conflict of interest declarations.

The collection and use of personal information are in accordance with the *Telefilm Canada Act*, the *Canadian Human Rights Act*, the *Canadian Multiculturalism Act* as well as (where applicable) the *Income Tax Act* and are in line with the provisions of the *Privacy Act*. In addition, such information may be used for statistical, planning, evaluation, and reporting purposes, as well as communications materials (e.g., press releases mentioning external advisors). The information is included in the personal information banks Members of Boards, Committees and Councils (PSU 919) and Voluntary Self-Identification (TFC PPU 025).

The personal information collected and used, among other things, for the purposes of assessing the candidacies from potential advisors under national promotion programs will be available to individuals occupying work positions that have a valid reason for accessing and using this personal information (the "designated staff"), including, but not limited to, designated staff in the department administering the program for which advisors are required. In the case of selected candidates, personal information may also be shared with designated staff in Telefilm's Finance, Legal Services and Communications departments, among others.
