PROGRAM INTENT AND OBJECTIVES

The Theatrical Exhibition Program (the "Program") of Telefilm Canada ("Telefilm") is a program that aims to support the exhibition of Canadian films in theatres across Canada.

The objectives of the Program are to:

- Encourage Canadian theatres to increase programming and attendance of Canadian films across the country;
- Improve promotion for the theatrical release of Canadian films;
- Foster public access to Canadian works.

1. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Be a company acting as a commercial theatre operator;
- Have their head office in Canada and carry out their activities in Canada;
- Have a ticket and box-office reporting system that complies with audiovisual industry standards.

In addition, applicants must have exhibited one or more Canadian feature films in Canada during the past calendar year, namely fictional or documentary films of 75 minutes or more that have:

- received a minimum of 6 out of 10 points from the Canadian Audio-Visual Certification Office (CAVCO);
 OR
- received a preliminary or final recommendation by Telefilm as an audiovisual coproduction governed by a Canadian treaty.

The list of films meeting these criteria will be published by Telefilm on its <u>website</u> at the beginning of each year, for the previous calendar year.

Only one funding request may be submitted per year to Telefilm for all the theatres operated by the same Corporate Group. For the purposes hereof, a Corporate Group is defined as the applicant and its Related Parties¹.

2. TERMS OF FUNDING

Funding under this Program is based on the number of screenings and admissions for a Canadian feature film distributed in Canada during the past year by the theatre(s) included in the funding application.

Subject to the availability of funds, Telefilm's funding will take the form of a non-repayable contribution calculated as follows:

- \$10 per screening; AND
- \$0.50 per admission;

¹ "Related Parties" are defined as parties that are related within the meaning of the CPA Canada Handbook, as that definition may be amended, completed or replaced from time to time, and as that definition may be adapted by Telefilm to the context of the film and television industry.

up to a maximum financial contribution of \$15,000 per theatre, per year, for a maximum of 3 theatres.

In addition to the above, for fiscal 2020-2021, Telefilm will grant an additional financial participation of \$10,000 per Corporate Group, for a maximum total financial participation of **\$55,000** per Corporate Group.

Telefilm's funding must be used towards promotional expenses for the theatrical release of Canadian films during the upcoming year.

3. HOW TO APPLY

All applicants must apply online using <u>Dialogue</u>. Applicants must submit the appropriate application form, duly completed and signed, together with all required documentation, via <u>Dialogue</u>. A list of all documents required at the time an application is submitted is available on the Program website. All subsequent documentation must be submitted on-line through <u>Dialogue</u>. If you have technical difficulties, please contact the Resource-Person indicated on the Program's website.

Applicants must list the Canadian films that they have exhibited over the past year, the number of screenings and the number of admissions for each of these films.

Please refer to Telefilm's website for more details on the application process, including the opening and closing dates for this Program.

4. GENERAL INFORMATION

While compliance with the guidelines is a prerequisite to eligibility for funding, compliance does not guarantee entitlement to Telefilm funds. Telefilm may make adjustments to its guidelines and application forms from time to time as required. Telefilm has full discretion in the application of these guidelines to ensure that funding is provided for those projects that meet its spirit and intent. In all questions of interpretation of either these guidelines, or the spirit and intent of this Program, Telefilm's interpretation shall prevail.

Any information, in any form, provided, obtained, created, or communicated in connection with the application is subject to the <u>Access to Information Act</u> and the <u>Privacy Act</u>.
